PORTLAND TIME BANK HAS NEW HOME!!

Hello. It is official – the Portland Time Bank and The Maine Time Banks Training Center have moved to 62 Elm Street in Portland, Maine.

Dozens of our Time Bank members helped by providing over 200 hours of exchanges during our relocation process. They helped with packing, moving, cleaning, and cooking to feed the crew. Others helped with unpacking and painting, and three people tiled a floor in our new kitchen. One member, a recognized local artist, will paint a new mural in the Time Café. We couldn't have done it without everyone who participated and are honored that our members embody the core values of time banking by helping with the move and so much more. Thank you!

Our new place is beautiful with freshly painted walls, clean carpets and wonderful, bright space for our staff and members to work in, including a wide berth for The Time Gallery. We are now handicap accessible with an exterior ramp, good parking and best of all we are still located in the Bayside Neighborhood. It is great to have all the staff on one shared floor with a large conference room for board and staff meetings, member potlucks, and various Time Bank trainings and events.

On Friday, August 3rd we are hosting an Open House from 12:00 Noon to 8:00 p.m. ALL are welcome, including non-members. This is also the day of the First Friday Art Walk from 5:00-8:00 p.m. Come! It will be a full day of
